Application Timeline and Eligibility

Portal Opens in Mid-September and Deadline (Max Dec 1 to Dec 31 or Feb 15)

- You should have all materials ready before that or at least one month before the deadline
- Apply before 1 or 2 month of Deadline (Best Practice)

Eligibility

- IELTS **MUST** – 6.5 Minimum (*There is a Backdoor path!!*)
 - CGPA ≥ 3.0
 - GRE – Optional in some program
 - WES – USA & CANADA have different WES, and Not Required.
 - LOR – Contact your professor as early as possible.
 - SOP & CV
 - **MUST** Follow the **Application Guidelines**

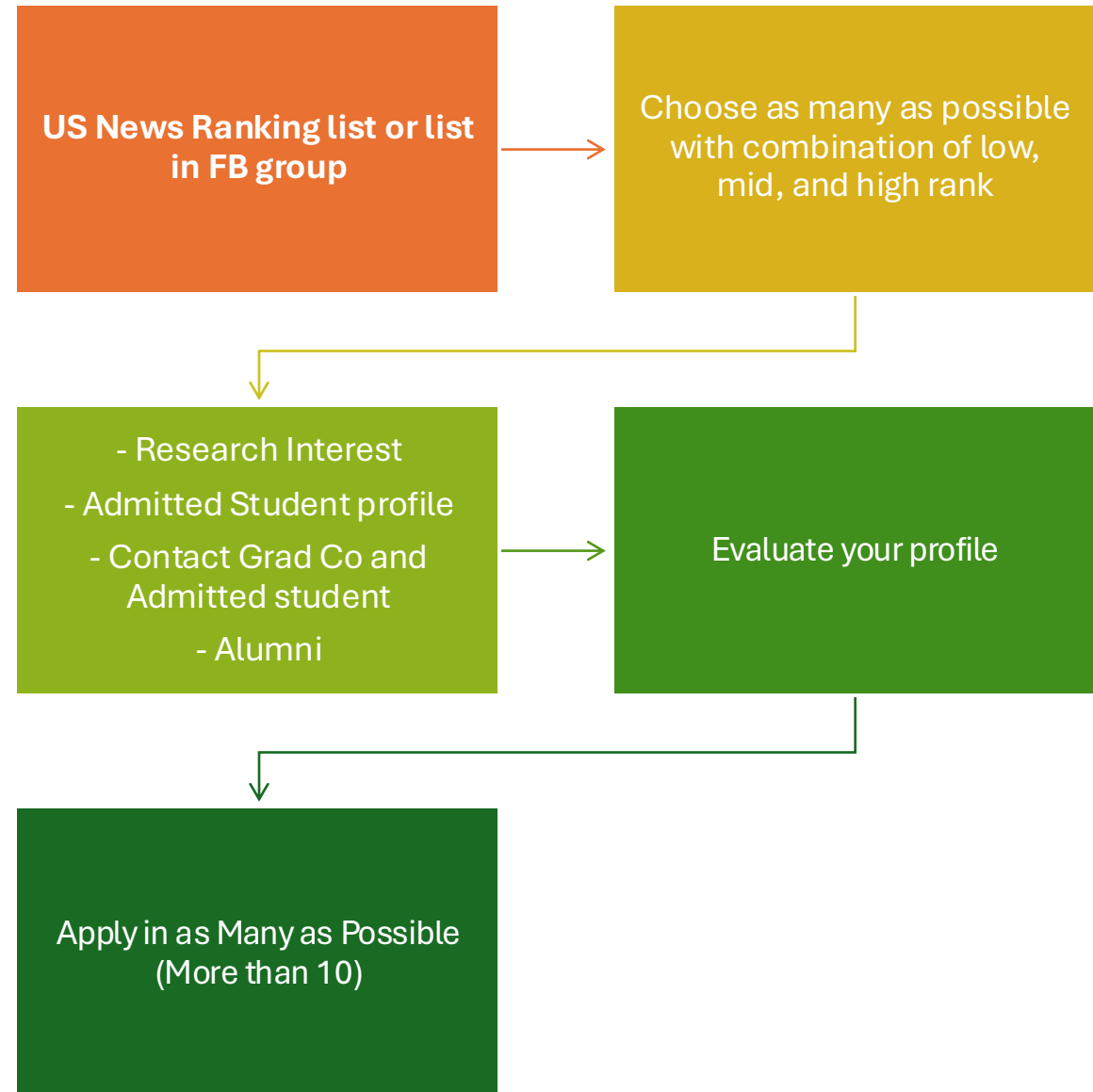

Application Hacks

- Complete Application Way before the Deadline (TOEFL +GRE +WES +LOR sending time will vary)
 - Contact graduate coordinator for questions
 - If you are applying to Biostatistics Program, You need SOPHAS (a centralized System for 50 to 60 Biostatistics Program)
 - SOPHAS will provide code for WES fee reduction
 - SOPHAS will provide Application fee waiver (particular amount)
 - Email graduate coordinator asking Application fee waiver
 - Join Virtual event for Application fee waiver
 - See websites of **ETS** for **GRE and TOEFL** for sales and promotional offer, e.g., Black Friday, Labor Day, Thanksgiving

Statement of Purpose (SOP)

Most Important Document of the Application

Max 1500 to 1600 Words (World Limit, 700 – 1000 in some University)

- **It should be focused, informative, and convey your research interests and qualifications.**
 - Describe your reasons and motivations for pursuing a graduate degree in your chosen degree program
 - Noting the experiences that shaped your research ambitions
 - Indicate briefly your career objectives
 - Concisely stating your past work in your intended field of study and in related fields.
 - **Write with Evidence, e.g.,**
 - **Bad-** I am interested in Bayesian Statistics.
 - **Better** – My fascination with Bayesian statistics grew while working on the MCMC algorithm without relying on packages as part of our coursework and exploring examples in WinBUGS.
 - **Particular Questions Asked in Program website**
 - **Build your own one and then ask review from alumni**

Letter of Recommendation (LOR)

Second Most Important Document of the Application

- **Recommender closely worked with you/know you**
 - No general statement, go for details as much as possible
 - Academic Recommender – Relate with Coursework, Leadership, Activity, any work academic work was impressed
 - Concisely stating your past work in your intended field of study and in related fields.
 - **Particular Questions Asked in Website of the Program**
 - **Build your own one and then ask review from alumni**

Curriculum Vitae (CV) / Resume

- Give more time to make a Standard CV
- 2 Page is enough, Not good to make more than 2 pages

Include these

- Academic Credentials
 - Publications (If any, include if working or submitted)
 - Research Experiences
 - Projects (if any)
 - Teaching Experiences (add any tuition related experiences)
 - Technical Skills
 - Workshop and Training
 - Awards/Scholarships
 - Leadership/Volunteer Activities

- It's important to create a standard LinkedIn Profile.
- Always update LinkedIn Profile.

- 3 or 2 sections (depends on instant exam environment)
- 20 Questions per section
- 35 minutes per section
- Practice Official ETS Books, Manhattan, GregMate.

Verbal Reasoning

- Short and Long Passages
 - Fill in the Blanks with 1, 2, and 3 blanks
 - 20 Questions per section
 - 30 minutes per section

GRE

Analytical writing Ability

- One "Analyze an Issue" task and one "Analyze an Argument" task
 - 30 minutes per task
